

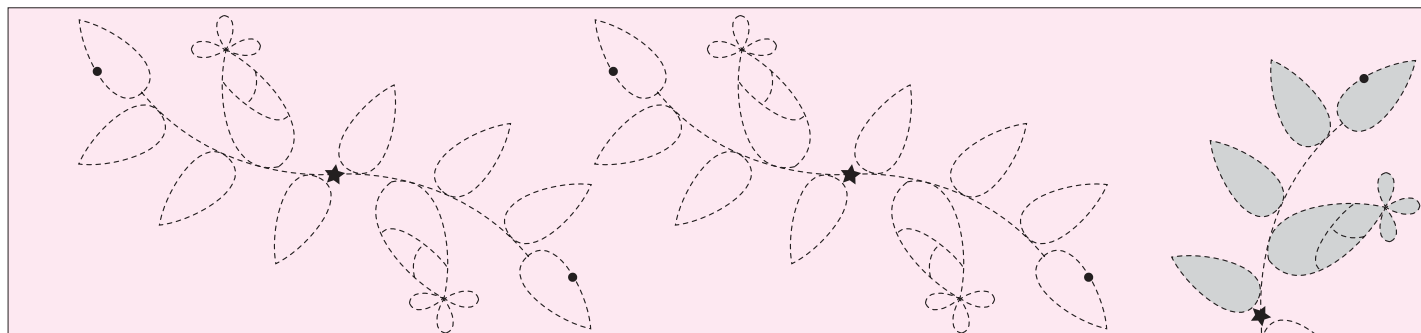
Climbing Roses

Designed especially for QNM readers by Mary Leman Austin, here are additional ways to position the motif for a 4" border and 6" block. A second applique motif is also shown.

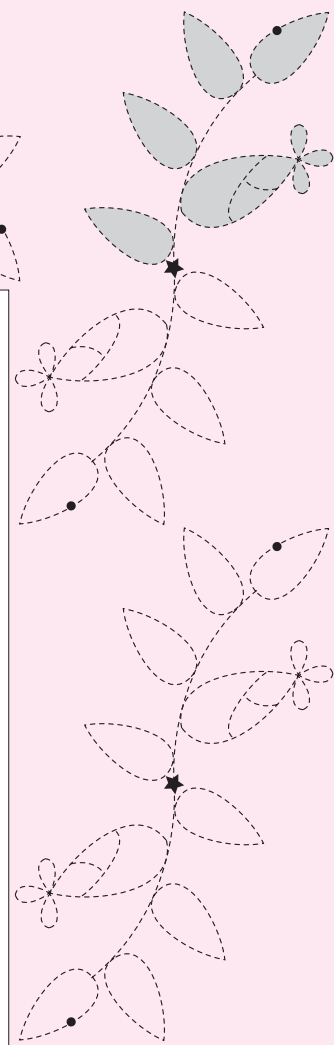
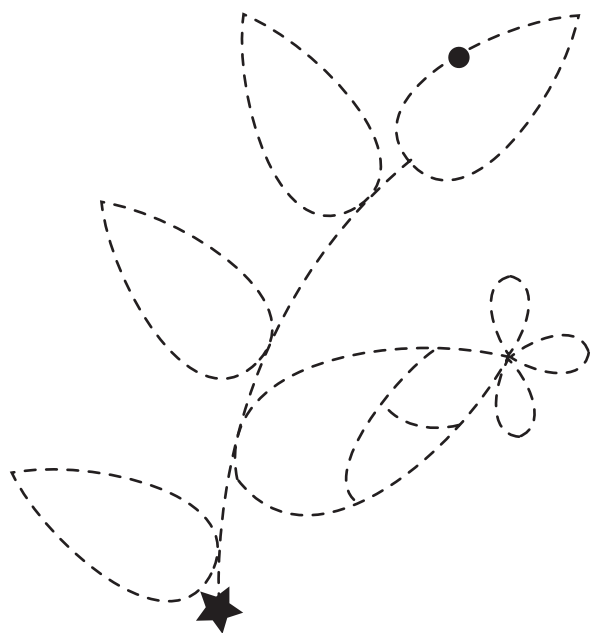
For all motifs: The measurements given on the diagrams are the finished block sizes and finished border widths. If you want to use them on larger or smaller blocks, change the size on a photocopy machine.

Cut tracing paper the finished size of the block or border width. Fold the paper to correspond to the dotted lines on each diagram. Unfold, and draw the design on the paper. Mark the motifs as described. Transfer the design to the quilt top, and machine or hand quilt.

4" Border



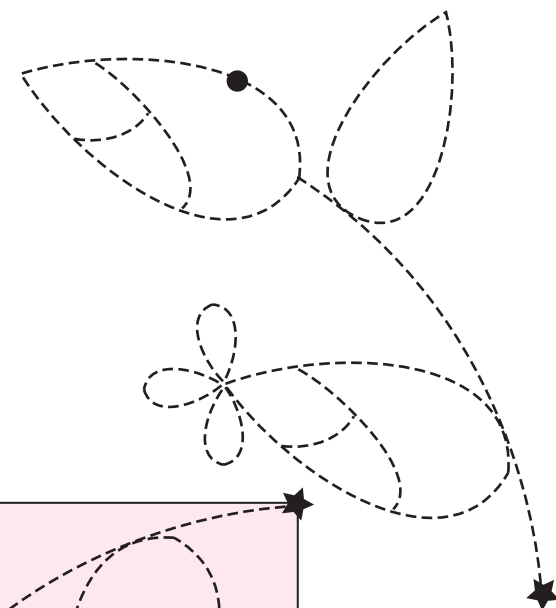
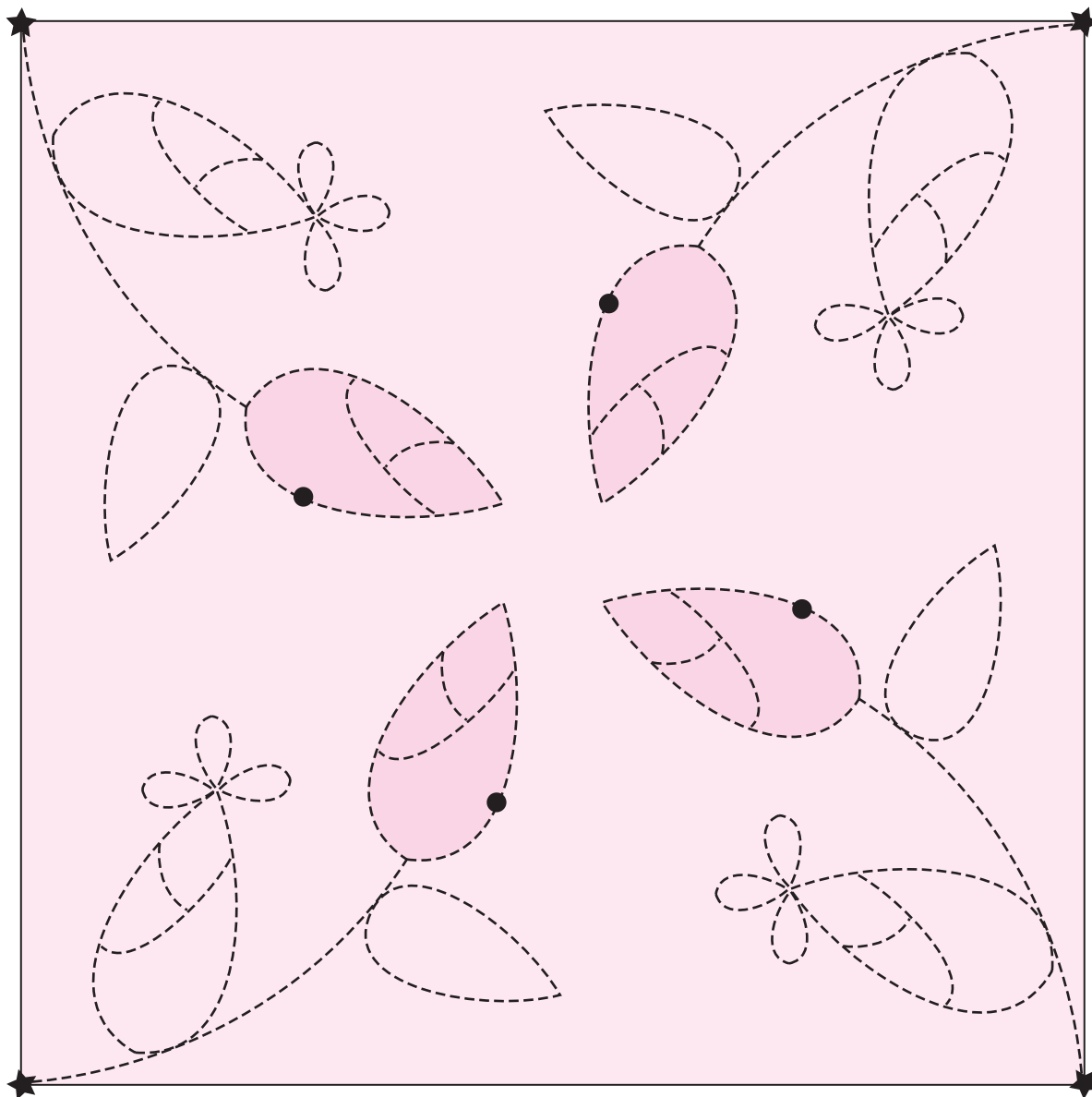
On a separate piece of tracing paper, mark half the inner motif, shown shaded within the border. Rotate the paper and mark a reversed image from the middle star. Mark this design on the tracing paper border, angling the motif as shown.



Climbing Roses

Arrange 4 stems in each corner, from the top dot to the star. Replace the top leaf with the bud, and include only one leaf as shown.

6" Block



Climbing Roses

8" Appliqued Block

Mark a 6" diameter circle on tracing paper. Mark 4 buds and 3 leaves along the circle. Mark an additional 4 buds angled into center. The center can be quilted with a grid, or make an applique center as shown.
