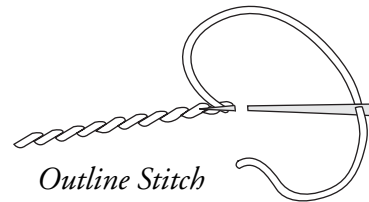

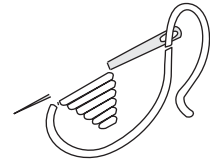
A favorite pet named Lee Ann was the inspiration for a fun cat quilt by Janine Holzman of Sitka, Alaska. The pattern for *Miss Kitty* is in the May 2007 issue of *Quilter's Newsletter Magazine*. Janine added a small strippy quilt on the back that has blocks that she made or collected. The patterns for each of the vertical rows will be given in seven installments on this website, beginning in May 2007.

Row 3: Butterflies

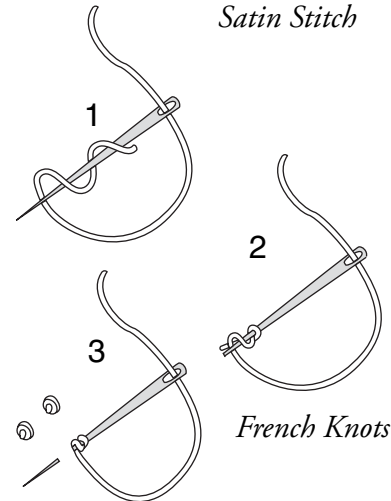
Cut a background strip that is 5½" x 42½". Prepare patches for 6 butterflies for your favorite method of applique. Fuse and/or sew the butterflies to the strip, referring to the quilt photo for placement. Sew the antennae with outline stitches. Use a satin stitch or french knot to add a dot at the antenna end. Cut 2 bright strips each 1" x 42½". Sew the bright strips to the long sides of the butterfly row. Sew to row 2 from the previous installment.
